

COUNCIL MEETING:

- a. <u>Roosevelt Park Day Committee-Set Meeting Time and Date-</u> The next time and date is needed our Roosevelt Park Day Committee. Staff is recommending setting two at this point before the event.
- **b.** <u>Finance and Personnel Committee-Set Meeting Time and Date</u>- As the fiscal year moves on, several changes have occurred and discussion is needed. The next time and date for the committee meeting is needed.
- c. <u>DPW Truck Purchase-State Purchasing System-</u> As staff has spent nearly two years budgeting and tracking down a possible new pick-up truck, one has become available through the state purchasing system and all information is included. This is a budgeted FY2023 expense.
- **d.** <u>Police Cruiser Purchase-State Purchasing System</u>- Like our DPW pick-up truck, in working with a new representative through the MiDeal system, an available 2023 GMC Tahoe PPV is available after a community has refused delivery of their order. It tentatively has been reserved for Roosevelt Park and is actually over \$3,000 less than the Ford Interceptor that was ordered in September of 2022.
- e. <u>FY2023 and FY2024 Mail Courier System- Council Authorization-</u> As we continue to explore ways to save money and per the City Councils second quarter budget amendments. No additional funds have been allocated to the Pitney Bowes postage meter and thus moving postage out of our office to a bulk mailer daily needs to be approved.
- f. <u>Roosevelt Park Election Commission-Formal Appointment</u>-With the transition of our legal counsel from a Parmenter Law associate back to a Parmenter Law partner, the formal appointment by name is needed for the Roosevelt Park Election Commission per the current City Charter.



DPW Pick-Up Truck Purchase-FY 2023 Date: August 21, 2023

As budgeted in the previously approved Fiscal Year 2022, the Department of Public Works Superintendent has received a quote for a ½ ton standard cab pickup truck per the MiDeal State Purchasing contract.

As of the beginning of the current fiscal year, there have been no options via the Ford MiDeal contract to submit an order. This GMC is only available as it the last unallocated order for the 2023 MiDeal contract. All other ½ tons have been vouched for and reserved through the GMC MiDeal contract for 2023.

This unit is not intended to be used for heavy towing of trailers, plowing of parking lots, or any heavy-duty activities and will replace the current seasonal parks staff ½ ton pick up truck. One change in operational use is that this will be an extended cab which will allow for tools and equipment to be stored and locked inside the cab and not just be placed in the bed of the truck. It will also be silver in color as the traditional yellow is no longer an option on the MiDeal purchasing platform.

This is the first DPW pickup truck replacement found since it was included in the Fiscal Year 2022 budget and the new unit will be replacing a 2005 Chevrolet that is a two-wheel drive. Staff is recommending along with the purchase of the new vehicle that Council authorize staff to place the 2005 unit up for public auction on a municipal surplus website as to gain a strong return on the vehicle. As noted, it is assembled and on the lot in Westland which means we can expect delivery in the coming weeks.

Financial Impact: The funds have been approved in FY 2023 in the Equipment Fund account 640-261-985.000 for this purchase.

Recommendation: Move to accept the quote from Todd Wenzel GMC as presented for the budgeted purchase in the amount of \$41,185.25 for a DPW pickup truck as presented per the MiDeal state purchasing price. Also, authorize staff to surplus sale the current 2005 Chevrolet 2WD pick-up through a public online auction to gain a maximum return on the unit resale once the new unit is outfitted and complete.

2023 GROWING SEASON

Editor's Note: Ted is taking a couple weeks of "vacation", tent camping with over 500 boys, ages 10 to 14, at Camp Hickory in Dunnville, Ontario. Therefore we'll excuse him from getting his regular Farm Report in. He did, however, provide his 2023 crop plan. (See Figure 1 on page 3.) This year we have more corn than usual planted south of Apple in order to accommodate the local demand for corn silage. All those corn fields will be chopped rather than harvested as grain. If the

demand is there, we may let some of the corn crop north of Apple go as silage as well.

INFRASTRUCTURE MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

SOUTH IRRIGATION STATION REPLACEMENT

As of July 20th, the new South Irrigation Station is in operation and pumping water to the fields! With the coordinated efforts of Kamminga & Roodvoets, Prein&Newhof, our Irrigation Operators, and our Operations Maintenance crew, we were able to work through the initial challenges to get the station performing to expectations. Only a few punch list items remain to be addressed.

SITE PAVING PROJECT

Our Site Paving Project includes the repair of a 66" Corrugated Metal Pipe culvert which had failed and caused a sinkhole. The culvert is in our interception ditch under an access ramp. As per the project specifications, the contractor slip-lined the old 66" pipe with new 48" ADS N-12 pipe and filled the gap between the two pipes with flowable fill. (ADS N-12 is a corrugated black plastic pipe.) Unfortunately, upon inspection, it was discovered that sections of the 48" pipe had separated at the joints. We therefore put a stop to the work on the culvert until the best path forward can be determined. In the meantime, the other aspects of the paving project are continuing and going well.

W STATION FORCE MAIN REPLACEMENT

A period of inactivity (due to MDOT restrictions) elapsed after the initial tree-clearing was done for the W Station Force Main Replacement, but the project is again moving forward. A preconstruction meeting was held on July 11th with Kamminga & Roodvoets and Prein&Newhof in preparation for beginning the force main installation portion of the project. Originally the contractor was planning on beginning the first week of August, but because of MDOT lane closure limitations over Labor Day, they will be starting work on September 5th.

SRF LOAN APPLICATIONS UPDATE

The scores are in for our SRF loan application projects. Our Clean Water SRF application scored 40 points out of a total possible 100 points. That score doesn't leave us with much hope of being awarded an SRF loan. Our Clean Water SRF projects were Q Station to C Station force main replacement and A Station to C Station force main replacement. Because both of these projects are critical (as emphasized by the recent break on the Q to C force main), we will be looking elsewhere for a loan. The estimated cost of replacing the two force mains is \$42M. As for our Drinking Water SRF application, we scored 55 points out of 100. Again, that's not a stellar score, but it's possible we may still be awarded an SRF loan for our project. We should know by the end of September. Our Drinking Water SRF project is the extension of the Whitehall Township municipal water line to serve the Township residents whose wells were contaminated with PFAS when the Whitehall Wastewater Treatment Plant was in operation.

FLOWS AND LAGOON LEVELS


The average daily piped wastewater flow (Fig. 2) received at the RRC in June was 10.9 MGD, 2.7% lower than the same period last year. Hauled waste flow for June (Fig. 3) was 11.55 MG, 11% lower than the same period last year. The volume of water in the storage lagoons (Fig. 4) near the end of June was 3,202 MG, 3.3% lower than it was at the same time last year.






Muskegon County Resource Recovery Center 2023 Crop Plan

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

State Revolving Loan Funds 101

The State Revolving Loan Fund (SRF) represents the single largest opportunity for communities to fund water infrastructure, pollution remediate, and conservation in the state. Thanks to reforms made in 2022, the process of accessing these funds has been

easier. This session will be an interactive crash course on SRF, looking at both the Clean Water and Drinking Water funds. Attendees will learn about recent changes to SRF structure, how to put together a successful application, and will be connected with the Community TA Providers Network, EGLE, and MI Water Navigator to get assistance as they pursue SRF applications.

Rural Community Perspectives and Priorities with Michigan's Office of Rural Development

The Michigan Office of Rural Development (ORD) was created via Executive Directive in 2022 by Governor Gretchen Whitmer to facilitate the state's efforts to build long-term prosperity in Michigan's rural communities. The ORD strategically focuses on key rural priorities including but not limited to housing, workforce, infrastructure, and community capacity building. In this session, the ORD will highlight its current and planned initiatives to support rural communities, discuss results of a statewide survey, and invite session participants living in or serving rural areas to share their community perspective and priorities.

Investing for Community Well-Being and Local Wealth Building

With billions of dollars in federal and state funding available, how can our communities access and invest new funds to improve community well-being and support local community wealth building? This panel discussion will highlight unique ways that Michigan communities are engaging their communities and investing ARP, Infrastructure Act, and Inflation Reduction Act funding to achieve these goals.

Immerse Yourself in the Botanic Garden at Historic Barns Park

The gorgeous botanical garden is in the heart of Traverse City and has an emphasis on plant species native to northwest Michigan. Come and learn about how the garden aids environmental preservation, recreation, and education.

History and Innovation at the Grand Traverse Commons

The Village at Grand Traverse Commons was once the Traverse City State Hospital and has been transformed into an economic center that is a place to live, work, play, shop, and explore. The Commons is a story of historic preservation and redevelopment, and the story is still being written. Join us on this tour to learn about the rich history and redevelopment of the buildings, a tour of a building that is not yet redeveloped and a walk through the 1883 underground steam tunnels. Telling Our Stories: Michigan Communities Should Learn to Brag

We know people stay or move to places where they see opportunity – for belonging, for quality of life, to start a family or a business. Michigan communities have an opportunity to encourage folks to move to the mitten state – if we make the choice to invest boldly in our communities and get better at telling the stories of what makes our communities special. This session will help you understand why we need to be better at promoting our state's assets and how to share the narratives of what makes our communities great places.

Movin' on Up: Retrofits for Existing Buildings

Buildings account for 40% of global carbon emissions, and 80% of the buildings that will exist by 2050 already exist today. Many of them date from the 1960s to the 1980s, consuming energy at an alarming and costly pace. Taking the whole lifecycle of materials into account, retrofitting buildings already in existence can help meet industry challenges and international decarbonization goals. Building retrofits can give old building systems a total makeover, like going from a 1970s polyester leisure suit to sleek 2020s athleisure. By utilizing existing buildings and cutting emissions in half, retrofits save both time and money.

Michigan as a Receiver Place for Climate Migration

As climate migration continues to play an effect on where folks are choosing to live, Michigan will become a potential hub for climate migrants. Michigan leaders are asking how we can pull out of our economic and demographic stagnation, and welcoming climate migrants. Learn how we need to act to make this potential into reality, and to ensure we can welcome growth without further sprawl eating our natural resources and budgets. This need is one part of a marketing campaign to future residents, but also requires considering both our physical planning and governance processes that those newcomers will be participating in.

Creating Cultures of Belonging Where Everyone Can T.H.R.I.V.E.

When a community has a culture that supports and nurtures everyone, a sense of belonging occurs. Creating cultures of belonging requires dedicated leaders and intentionality. "Creating Cultures of Belonging" offers opportunities for individuals to work Together, Help others, be Resilient, be Innovative, be Valued, and be Effective (T.H.R.I.V.E.). This highly engaging session is hosted by MBC-LEO and led by Certified Diversity Executive and President of TCB Consulting, Dr. Tonya C. Bailey. The session will provide tangible tools for participants to use immediately after the session has concluded

Staffing Secrets from an HR Pro
