<p>Public Act 660 of 2018, was approved by Governor Snyder on December 28, 2018, and amended the General Property Tax Act to provide statutory framework to ensure proper assessing in order to guarantee the highest quality assessments for taxpayers, as well as local units. PA 660 contains several requirements in statute (MCL 211.10g (1)) that local units and assessors must follow. Local units are required to ensure that all requirements are being met beginning in the 2022 tax year.</p> <p>Subject to state tax commission guidelines the local unit is required to publish a policy under which its assessor's office is reasonably accessible to taxpayers. Per this requirement, the attached policy has been created to fulfill the above statutory requirements.</p>

**POLICY AND PROCEDURE FOR THE PUBLIC INSPECTION AND COPYING OF PUBLIC RECORDS IN LIEU OF CUSTOMARY BUSINESS HOURS**

- 1) Requests for public inspection and copying of public records may be made verbally and/or in writing.
- 2) Said requests may be directed to the township/city official and/or authorized individual responsible for said public records.
- 3) Any requests made pursuant to Michigan's Freedom of Information Act, shall be made to the FOIA coordinator and shall be subject to the statutory requirements of FOIA.
- 4) If verbal request is made, the responding township/city official and/or authorized individual shall prepare a checklist of items/records requested to be copied and/or inspected. Said listing shall be presented to the requesting party on the date set for inspection or copying.
- 5) The responding township/city official and/or authorized individual may require the requesting party to counter sign the check list to indicate compliance with the verbal request.
- 6) The responding township/city official and/or authorized individual shall be responsible for the production of the requested copies.
- 7) The requesting party shall be billed for the copies and preparation time, if applicable, pursuant to the schedule of charges established by the Township Board/City Council.
- 8) If the request is for inspection of public record, the responding township/city official and/or authorized individual shall respond in a timely manner, not to exceed 5 business days, from the date of said request. Said response shall indicate the date, time and place when said public inspection of the requested public records shall take place.
- 9) The establishment of the date and time of the public inspection of the requested public records shall be in the discretion of the responding township official and/or authorized individual. The place designated for the requested inspection shall be the Township/City Hall or the location where said public records are officially retained.
- 10) The responding township/city official and/or authorized individual shall allow such inspection between the hours of 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday, unless mutually agreed to by the responding township official/city and/or authorized individual and the requesting party.

## Chief's Monthly Summary

In December 2022 the Roosevelt Park Police Department (RPPD) continued to emphasize efforts to ensuring the safety of the citizens in our community. Dangerous driving behaviors jeopardize the safety of other people on the road. We continue to enforce traffic laws with the goal of reducing collisions, educating the citizens in our community, and keeping our community safe. This was achieved through the establishment of preventative patrols to manage specific categories of unlawful driving behavior. Traffic enforcement strategies are based on collision data, enforcement activity records, speed radar studies, traffic volume, and conditions. Several methods contribute to our overall goal: arrests, citations, warnings, and education. Through these methods and efforts, we strive to educate our community on the importance of safe driving as we aim to keep our community safe. Data for law enforcement efforts is listed below, however I would be remiss if I didn't point out that in 2022 your RPPD Officers wrote 659 citations, made 427 field contacts, and effected 231 criminal arrests. This month's citations alone (133) out paces the total number written for all of 2021 (126)

Each December, members of the RPPD, along with officers from other area agencies take children in need shopping for toys, clothing, and whatever they want or need. This year RPPD participated in two Shop with a Cop events, December 8<sup>th</sup> at Walmart, and December 13<sup>th</sup>, at Meijer. Nearly two hundred children benefited from these experiences. RPPD officers supplemented donated funds with their own money to help bring some Holiday joy to children in need. On December 29<sup>th</sup>, Officers from RPPD and NSPD participated in Bowling with the Blues, a free event to children to get them out of the house and positively interacting with Officers. Held at Sherman Bowl, Officers engaged in fun, relationship building time with area youth. Way to go RPPD Heros!

The historic, Christmas weekend blizzard saw a significant decrease in calls for service as many responsible citizens heeded the ample warnings provided by local news outlets and stayed at home. Officers braved sub-zero temperatures, and complete white-out conditions, fielding traffic crashes, stranded motorists, and even transporting elderly citizens to appointments and trips to pick up prescriptions. Roosevelt Park PD would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge and send a special, heartfelt **THANK YOU** to all of the members of the Roosevelt Park DPW team. They were truly performing life saving services in what has to be one of the worst winter storms we've seen in a very long time. Much appreciation for our RP DPW!!

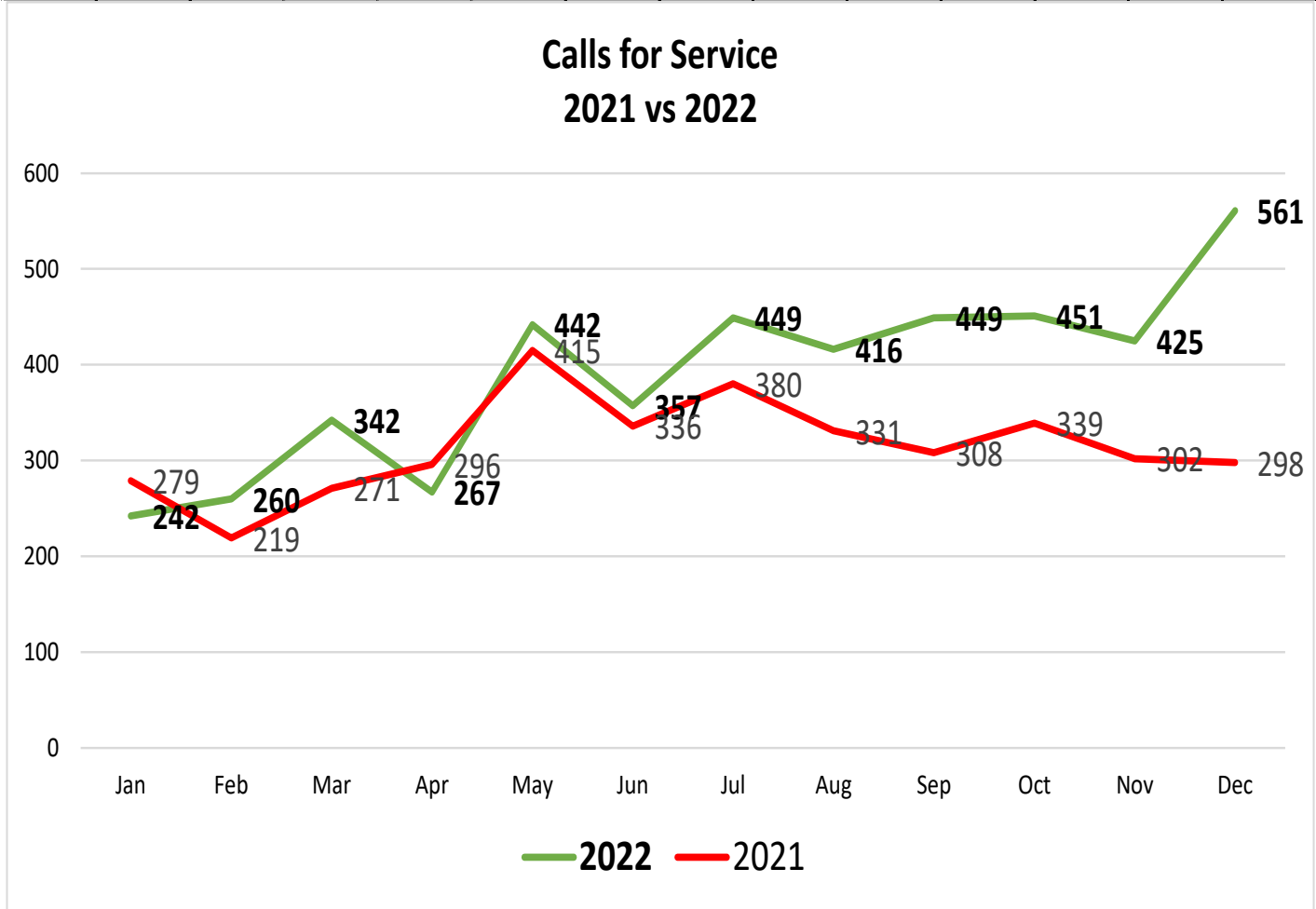
