a. Active Agenda Items

COUNCIL MEETING:

- a. <u>Resolution to Establish Millage Rate-Fiscal Year 2024-</u> The City is required to hold a public hearing on the proposed millage rate and annual budget. The millage rate is proposed to remain at 16.6 mils, which is the same as the past decade. The proposed FY 2024 budget was developed using this millage rate. Once public comments are heard and the public hearing is closed, the City Council can adopt the millage rate (attached L-4029) and the proposed budget if they so see fit. These actions can occur during the September 5th meeting but must be completed per the City Charter no later than September 18th.
- b. <u>Resolution to Appropriate Funds-Fiscal Year 2024</u>- Once public comments are heard and the hearing is closed, the Council can adopt the budget by resolution. The included resolution outlines the proposed estimated spending and estimated revenues within the general fund and the component funds. These actions can occur during the September 5th meeting but must by charter be approved no later than the September 18th meeting.
- c. <u>Halloween 2023- Set time and Date</u>- As the City Council has done annually, the formal citywide time and date need to be set for the 2023 Halloween Trick or Treating event. In the past, the council has set the times as 5:30 pm-7:00 pm on October 31st.
- d. <u>MI Community Center Grant</u>- As outlined in previous meetings, the State of Michigan has created a grant opportunity to assist local communities in the renovation and updating of community centers. There is \$60 million allocated for this program and the application is nearly identical to the SPARK's round two grant submission of which there was only \$25 million available.





CITY OF ROOSEVELT PARK RESOLUTION NUMBER: 23-09 TRUTH IN TAXATION

WHEREAS, MCL 211.24e provides that without specific action taken by the City Council, the City shall not levy ad valorem property taxes for operating purposes for the ensuring fiscal year, which would yield an amount more than the sum of the taxes levied at the base rate on additions within the City for the ensuing fiscal year, plus an amount equal to the taxes levied for operating purposes for the concluding fiscal year on the existing property, and

WHEREAS, the City Council may approve the levy of an additional millage rate, within its present authorized or proposed millage rate only after providing certain notice to the public and holding a public hearing for the purpose of receiving testimony and discussing the levy of an additional millage rate for the ensuing fiscal year, and

WHEREAS, the City Council has been advised the taxable value for the 2024 tax year of property located within the City of Roosevelt Park is \$123,345,860 and

WHEREAS, based upon the state equalized valuation of the City, the operating tax would be limited to 16.6 mills, and

WHEREAS, the City Council, after examination of its estimated operating expenses for fiscal year 2024, and estimated revenues based on state equalized valuation, has determined that the best interest of the City requires the continued levy of 16.6 mills to provide for sufficient operating revenue for the City for operating purposes for the ensuing year;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council does hereby approve the total millage rate of 16.6 mills be levied for the Fiscal Year 2024.





WHEREAS, the County of Muskegon has provided for public transportation services since 1974 through the operation of the Muskegon Area Transit System program on behalf of and in cooperation with local units of government; and

WHEREAS, a West Michigan Regional Transit Governance and Organizational Transition Study was commissioned and conducted with assistance from the West Michigan Shoreline Regional Development Commission, the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Muskegon urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the study recommends that the County of Muskegon reduce its role in the governance of the public transit program and that a public transit authority be formed by the local units of government; and

WHEREAS, the County of Muskegon desires to transition control of the public transit program and hereby expresses its intent to reduce or relinquish its role in an orderly manner in deference to an authority formed by the local communities;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the County of Muskegon urges its local partner communities to continue active efforts toward timely formation of a transit authority to maintain and improve public transportation services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County of Muskegon will provide all reasonable supports and assistance to the local partner communities and the public transit authority as needed to facilitate and maintain community services through this transition.
